The Mosaic Rooms is honoured to present a collaborative exhibition between the Iraqi artist Hanaa' Malallah and the UK duo kennardphillipps. Hanaa' Malallah is regarded as one of Iraq's leading and most innovative contemporary artists. kennardphillipps (Peter Kennard and Cat Phillipps) have been working together since 2003 to produce work in reaction to the invasion of Iraq. The three artists have developed this exhibition in response to each other's practises, creating a uniquely resonant conversation on the invasion/occupation of Iraq.

This exhibition features large-scale collages, installations, photomontage pieces and sculptures, many exhibited here for the first time.

kennardphillipps' work manipulates and subverts press material on the Iraq war to create opposing images and narratives. They have exhibited internationally, including in group shows at the Tate, V&A, Design Museum, and Imperial War Museum.

Malallah's work uses burnt canvas, cloths, wire, found objects and paint to create violently abstract yet sensuous pieces. She has exhibited internationally in solo and group shows. Her work is in a number of important collections, including at the British Museum.

The Mosaic Rooms will have a special programme of talks and events during the exhibition on the nature of democracy and protest entitled WHAT PURPOSE FREE SPEECH WHEN NO ONE LISTENS? Please visit www.mosaicrooms.org for more details.
