About the artist

Heba Y. Amin is an Egyptian artist who looks at the world we live in. She gathers historical artefacts, stories, photographs and films. With these materials she imagines different futures, and lets us hear the voices of people who may not usually be heard.



In *The General's Stork*, Heba explores the true life story of a stork which was believed to be a spy.

• **Practice** your Arabic by drawing over the word below. Remember to write from right to left.








Your own bird's eye view collage:
