

Artist biography

Abderrahim Yamou was born in Casablanca in 1959. He left Morocco to study biology in France, before changing to sociology with a focus on researching contemporary Moroccan art. He gave up his studies to become a self-taught artist, working in both painting and sculpture. He has exhibited widely in group and solo shows throughout Europe and North Africa. Yamou is based between Paris and Marrakech.

Yamou Working from Life

The Mosaic Rooms is delighted to present *Working From Life*, an exhibition by one of the leading contemporary Moroccan artists Abderrahim Yamou. This exhibition will feature new and recent paintings from the *Inside* and *Gène Bleu* series.

Yamou's paintings are inspired by the organic processes of the natural world, by continuity and change, and by the tensions and instabilities between these two states. Beneath the surface of his exquisite paintings, produced in both large and small scale, there is also an underlying sense of disquiet. 'In my work', writes the artist, 'the obvious formal reference to biology or to botany is the sign of a constant will to probe the living and to paint the energy necessary for the creation of life itself. The world of plants — an endless source of new forms — is a fertile metaphor of our human interactions and aspirations.'

In these paintings Yamou appears to capture a frozen moment, yet he also manages to suggest potential forms and spaces, which grow, move, evolve and mutate.
